GUIDELINES FOR 4-H PARTICIPANTS AT COUNTY /STATE FAIR

- 1. There will be no use of illegal drugs, alcoholic beverages, tobacco products or profanity.
- 2. Since the youth are representing the Cornell Cooperative Extension 4-H Program, appropriate attire and behavior is expected. Shirts with logos, sayings, etc., that conflict with 4-H standards will not be permitted. Specific criteria for appropriate attire may be provided by the coordinating adult.
- 3. 4-H youth will be charged for any property defacements for which they are responsible for.
- 4. 4-H youth must remain in their designated sleeping area between the hours of 10:00 PM and 6:00 AM. Any exception to this rule must be for a bonafide 4-H activity and it must be approved by their designated chaperone.
- 5. Youth are expected to behave in a manner that is aligned with the goal of the 4-H program. Because the goal of 4H is to develop citizenship, leadership and life skills of youth proper behavior of all 4-H representatives is not only expected but required.
- 5. A copy of the completed Chaperone Designated/Parental Permission Form must be in the possession of the 4-Her at all times.

I understand that failure to abide by any of these rules and those of my designated Chaperone, will result in immediate suspension from the County or State Fair. I will be sent home at my own expense or my parent's/guardian's expense. I also understand that my County or State Fair awards/premiums will be forfeited.
